# THE PRAYERS AND BIBLE READINGS

#### **COLLECT:**

Almighty and everlasting God, who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross: grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

#### **POST COMMUNION PRAYER:**

Lord Jesus Christ, you humbled yourself in taking the form of a servant, and in obedience died on the cross for our salvation: give us the mind to follow you and to proclaim you as Lord and King, to the glory of God the Father.

#### **FOOD FOR THOUGHT:**

Even the most faithful of Christians very often don't go to church very much throughout the week. Church, they often think, is for Sundays. Well, maybe in this Holy Week, make a change. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday are among the most momentous days of the year, and we damage our spiritual lives by not marking them properly. Next Sunday will be full of joy and celebration, and rightly so, but you won't know that in its full depth unless you have taken the time to dwell on Jesus' journey to the Cross.

Something else we don't do often enough is pray for a sustained, long time. Holy Week is a time to go beyond your five minutes here, your fifteen there. After the Maundy Thursday service at 8pm, church will remain open till midnight for people to sit in silence with God. Equally, on Friday, church will be open all day as a silent space before our 'hour at the cross' at 2pm, itself a meditative service. We often say we don't have time to pray as we should – that should not be the case on these two days.

You might think, 'but what would I do with the time?'. Well, maybe just sit in the silence and see what happens! But if, like many of us, you need something to focus on – how about a deep slow reading of several bible passages? Use the stories of Jesus' last hours from the Gospels; read Psalms 69 and 22; read the awesome Isaiah 53, or the deeply disturbing Genesis 22 (which will, if the vicar holds his nerve, form the focus of our Good Friday service...)
