SAVE THE LYCHGATE

The lychgate which stands at the main entrance to the churchyard of St Lawrence Church was commissioned as a memorial to Queen Victoria in 1901 and paid for by donations from the people of the parish.

It was designed by Architect Fredrick Kinnier—Tarte of St Albans and constructed by a local tradesman Edwin Glennister. The construction was carried out over 3 months during the summer of 1902.

The construction is primarily an oak timber framed structure with traditional mortice and tenon joints to the upper sections and with metal dowels and through bolts to the balustrade, posts and groundsill.

After one hundred and twenty-four years of providing a focal point in the village, a fitting entrance to the churchyard and shelter for all who need it, it is now in need of specialist restoration.

The cost of this work is £15,000 and once again we need the help of all who live in the village, use the facility or value its importance to help us restore it for generations to come.

New Adventures for Thomas and James

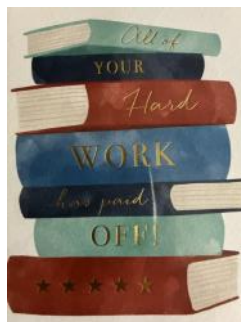

Churchyard in August: Singing the Praises of Dead Hedges

If you have been to visit the Church of the Ascension recently in a car you may have used the car part at the back of the church. There you may have seen an amazing dead hedge that the team at Bedmond have created. Well done and congratulations to Wendy, Janine, Myka, Hayley and Marco.

The dead hedge marks the boundary between the area that the cars can use to park and the area that is reserved for wildlife. This has inspired us to create a dead hedge at St Lawrence. The one at the Tin Church is expertly executed with great care and precision with strong upright wooden stakes and then horizontal pruned branches, twigs and garden waste packed between the



uprights making a fence. This is exactly how you would build it if you follow instructions and it looks amazing.

There are many reasons why a dead hedge is a great for wildlife and great news for the wider environment. In a way you could say that a dead hedge is full of life. Here are four reasons why a dead hedge is good for our churchyard. Firstly it saves taking all the dead branches off site so reduces the need to transport them away from the churchyard. Secondly it provides a great wildlife corridor with nesting sites for birds, areas for hedgehogs to hibernate and insects and beetles to thrive as the dead material starts to rot down. Thirdly it provides a boundary that fits in with the landscape blending in seamlessly. Fourthly, as the layers start to decompose new layers can be added on top.

The dead hedge we have started to build at St Lawrence will not be as compact as the one at the Tin Church

but it will certainly blend in and you may not even have noticed it. It will and certainly already has reduced the need to have an obvious pile of dead wood in one place. It is a little more rustic, not so tightly packed and it makes use of the old metal fence that is already along our boundary with what was Margaret House. In starting to

make the dead hedge we are also trying to make sure that the graves along that boundary do not disappear as the trees grow further out into the churchyard covering up the graves. Thank you to the team at Bedmond for inspiring us.

The kind of items that we are looking for are itemised below:

- Children's /toddlers/babies clothes and knitted wear. *Many of you have been knitting and collecting items for us during the year, so if you have these stored in your homes, please let us know so we can arrange collection.*
- Bed sheets
- Blood Pressure machines
- **Bandages of all varieties, cotton wool, gauze, incontinence pads for adults**
- **PPE masks and gloves**
- Equipment for physiotherapy: **wheelchairs** and crutches
- Reels of cotton thread and fabric for the tailoring school and materials for making reusable sanitary ware
- Ladies and girls knickers (new)
- Maintenance tools

For the community:

- Footballs and netballs for the Community Based Organisations' youth groups

For the nurseries:

- Appropriate books and learning materials (please contact for advice)
- Chalk

For the Secondary School

- Stationery, Maths equipment

(calculators, rulers, compasses, protractors etc.)

- Sturdy footballs and netballs (deflated!!) plus pumps
- English novels, English grammar text books. Good News Bibles
- **Chalk** for blackboards

From the Vicar

Time and Talents—September 2026

‘Come unto me all you who are heavy laden,’ said Jesus, ‘and I will give you a spot on umpteen rotas’.

Our parish is, as has often been pointed out, a *busy* one. At one level, of course, that’s wonderful: it means that there’s life and energy and enthusiasm. It is however also a mixed blessing—along with that busyness can come a sense of exhaustion and overload. Sometimes, also it can perversely put people off from getting involved—perhaps through anxiety that it might prove too much, a sense that others have already got everything sorted and don’t need or want help, or just not knowing how to start.

This month, we’ll be running our ‘time and talents’ campaign and I want to start it by saying two things.

The first is a massive, massive **thank you** to everyone who volunteers in any way in our two churches. I reckon that must be well over one hundred people, often working away quietly and unremarked—and yet, if they suddenly

stopped, things would fall apart quickly enough. People are astounding generous and committed, and the last thing I would want this campaign to do is to sound as they should all be doing *more*. The first note is to rejoice and be grateful for what you’re doing already.

The second is to say to anyone who *wants* to do more: **we want you too!** Please don’t hang back out of uncertainty or nervousness, just say what you’re thinking about and let’s give it a go. There are so many areas of our church’s life where you could get stuck in: in the rest of this article, I’ll name but a few. Throughout the month of September, there’ll be an opportunity to think about many more and to indicate where you might like to be part of things.

So, for example, there’s Sunday worship. Let’s start with how people actually get there: could you offer a lift once or twice a month to someone? We have people paying £15 or £20 a week in Uber and taxi fares simply to get to church—let’s stop that. Or could you be part of the welcome team, giving a friendly smile to strangers as they come through the door, making them feel at home here? Could you read the lesson, or lead the prayers, or join the team of servers? (Could you even *lead* some services, or become a preacher? If that thought has ever occurred, speak to me!).

Perhaps though, the thought of being up front terrifies you. So why not sit at the back instead, and make sure the microphones work and the livestream happens? We need help too with hospitality after the service down in the

church hall. And if none of that sounds like you, what about care for the buildings where all this happens? We don't have beautiful places of worship by accident, but only because people look after them so well—could that be you?

Nearly a third of Church of England churches have no children attending regular Sunday worship. *No* children. That is disastrous—and luckily, that is not our situation. Actually, forget 'luckily': it's because we have people who give wonderfully of their time to make church somewhere where children want to come. Hurrah for the Seekers team! But they urgently need help—it would obviously be amazing if someone would help to lead the sessions, but it could be something as easy as volunteering simply to be an additional adult presence in the room. Or, outside of Seekers, it might be making sure our lovely new children's area is tidy and well stocked before every Sunday service. Outside of Sundays, there is Messy Church—heaving with children and always in need of adults who will help cook, do crafts, sing songs or simply be a welcoming presence. Our weekly Tiny Tots is also in serious need of help—we're regularly getting over twenty children there, with their parents and carers: it is the most lovely and fun and rewarding of groups . . . but my goodness, it's quite full-on. If you could give just a couple of hours once a month, it would make a wonderful difference.

Perhaps that all sounds rather exhausting. What if I said that some of the real involvement we need is simply

people who are happy to sit, have a cup of tea, and chat with people? Often just with *one* person, who might be going through a tough time, be a bit lonely, be in grief? We are nothing if we're not a community that looks after each other, and offers support to those around us and *most* of the time what's really needed is just that: *time*. An hour, two hours a month, just offering friendship and a listening ear? That would be among the best gifts you could possibly make to our parish life.

That life can't happen without governance—without people making sure it's all run properly, that the money's there to do it, and that it all works together in God's service. That's why we've got a Parochial Church Council (PCC), and why we need Churchwardens, and Treasurers, and Parish Safeguarding Officers. We are unbelievably blessed at the moment in the people who fill those roles—but they've got to be allowed to stand down sometime! Where will their successors come from? Might you have the time and the ability to be part of the team that leads this parish? We can't afford for people to be shy, or to think others will always step forward—it really *could* be you, and it *must* be some of you.

Think about it. Pray about it. Talk about it. And then, later this month, fill in that Time and Talents slip which will be coming round . . . and it'll be great to have you involved!

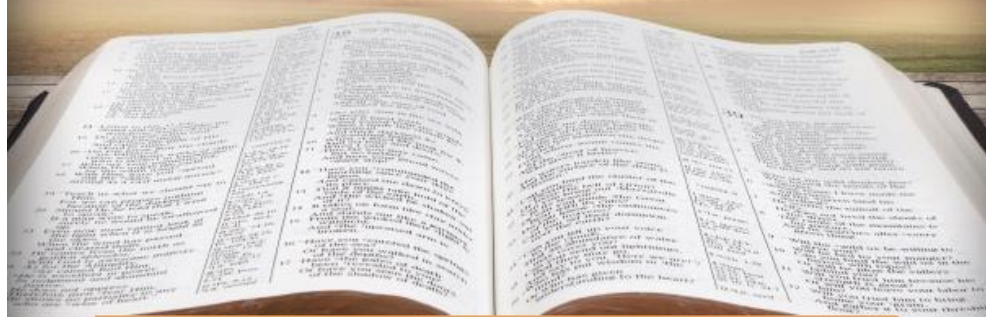
